Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2022-23 educational progress for Fruitport Middle School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2023-24 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-23. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. Our school has not been given one of these labels.

In a continued effort to close the gap between our special education students and general education in math proficiency we have implemented multiple strategies. First, we have continued to offer both co-taught and resource level math classes to ensure a least restrictive environment for our students receiving support in mathematics. We continue to utilize the Illustrative Mathematics curriculum resource in our general education classrooms as well as our co-taught and resource classrooms ensuring exposure to grade level content to all students. Our special education teachers continue to work with general education teachers to help make appropriate accommodations and modifications when needed while continuing to maintain rigor in the subject area. In an effort to address students behind in reading and math more than 2 grade-levels, we have implemented Academic Recovery Classes that last for one quarter.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

- 1. **PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL:** There is only one middle school in the district so most students matriculate from one of the three elementary schools. Additionally students from outside the district are allowed to enter through the Schools of Choice process.
- 2. **THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN:** The current FMS School Improvement Plan focuses on multiple areas including Language Arts, Mathematics, and Climate and Culture.

Language Arts: All departments (ELA, Math, Social Studies, Science, and Related Arts) spent time creating writing assignments and rubrics for evaluation of writing. Students were challenged with writing assignments across all subject areas. Staff in all content areas worked to give meaningful feedback to individual students on their writing. The Language Arts Department continued to pilot and explore different curriculum resources for the purpose of adopting a building wide resource for grades 6-8.

Mathematics: Math teachers are receiving group and individual coaching. Staff members continue to participate in professional development surrounding the curriculum resource and well as grade level content. The Math Department has spent time working as a unit on areas including scope and sequence development, data review, and development of common multi-unit assessments.

Climate and Culture: Our building continues to implement PBIS across the entire building. We have formally implemented a Tier 3 support team and strategies to identify and build specific plans for individual students in need of this level of support. We utilized our WINN Time each Friday afternoon to show Social-Emotional Videos to students followed by student and teacher led discussions for reflection on each video.

- 3. **A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL**: The middle school houses the Moderately Cognitively Impaired, MOCI, program for 4 school districts in the Eastern Service Unity of Muskegon County.

IDENTIFY THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES: We know that parent and family support of students' academic work is important to the success of our students.
